## MULANJE MISSION HOSPITAL 2022 CBM FUNDED ACTIVITIES REPORT 1.0 BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Mulanje Mission Hospital is in Mulanje district. It is located in Mulanje Central Constituency. It serves a population of 94,832. (H.S.A head count data 2022).

Administratively it offers its services under 3 Traditional Authorities (T/A) 25 Group Village Headmen (G.V.H) and 110 Villages. These Traditional Authorities are; Chikumbu, Mkanda and Mabuka.

Tropical cyclone Anna struck the district on 25<sup>th</sup> January,2022 which among other things it destroyed sanitary facilities which posed a danger of Cholera and other sanitary related diseases. Mulanje Mission Hospital started to respond on 2<sup>nd</sup> July, 2022 with funding from Christian Blind Mission (CBM).

#### 1.1 VISION AND MISSION

All activities herein are in line with the vision of Mulanje Mission Hospital which is to have a transformed catchment area where all the people have access to safe water, improved sanitation and practicing safe hygiene behavior and its mission which is to provide strategic leadership leading to well-coordinated health education, provision of portable water, Construction of improved sanitation facilities at all levels in the catchment area.

#### 2.0 MAIN OBJECTIVE

The main objective of the exercise was to have communities that have reduced incidences of Cholera and other water and sanitation related diseases.

#### 2.1 SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

The specific objectives of the exercise were as follows:

- ➤ To have an increased number of sanitation facilities in T/A Chikumbu, Mkanda and Mabuka.
- > To have communities that is practicing safe hygiene practices.

#### 3.0 IMPLEMENTATION

#### 3.1 INTRODUCTION OF THE PROGRAMME TO THE COMMUNITY

The water and sanitation programme kick started by paying a courtesy call to the Senior Chief Chikumbu and the Medical Assistant In charge for Chisitu Health Centre.

There after Senior Disease Control Assistance (SDCA<sup>s</sup>) and Health Surveillance Assistant (H.S.A<sup>s</sup>) responsible for the concerned Villages were briefed outlining the activities of the programme. Ten villages were selected as a pilot programme and their names and demographic data is as appended below in a table form;

#### 3.2 SELECTION CRETERIA

The composition of the local leaders who attended the meetings comprised of the following cadre: Chiefs, Village Health Committees (VHCs), Village Development Committees (VDCs), safe Motherhood committees (SMCs), and Hospital Advisory Committees (HACs), this grouping after being briefed identified 50 beneficiaries to be considered for pit latrine construction programme.

The selection criteria for a household to be considered in this programme the following criteria was used; their pit latrine must have been destroyed by the storm, they were poorest of the poor, the vulnerable groups like the elderly, disabled, child headed families and those who were able to find the resources for construction of the pit latrines. After the beneficiaries were identified they were called for a briefing and later they were trained in san plat casting and construction of pit latrine.

#### 3.3 MOBILISATION AND VERIFICATIONS

After the beneficiaries had dug the pit latrines, collected sand, quarry stones and moulded bricks, the health worker responsible for the village and the co-coordinator went around the villages to verify that materials are ready to commerce construction works.

San plat casting training was conducted for 1 day and the beneficiaries went to their respective homes to cast and install their san plats on pit latrine. They continued with constructing the super structure for the pit latrines. When they reached the gible level the team would come again for the second verification thereafter they were supplied with roofing materials

The programme also encouraged the communities to provide wash hand facilities on each and every pit latrine for washing hands after defecating. Key health education messages were also pasted on the wall of the pit latrine.

#### 5.0 STRENGTH

- ➤ San plats being moulded and installed are environment friendly and conserves trees which is in line with governments goals
- Some beneficiaries constructed double pit latrine using their own resources which is good news for the sustainability of the programme.
- ➤ The village Health committees were able to conduct supervision and follow ups on their own.
- ➤ The activities were implemented within the recommended time despite logistical problems.
- ➤ The Mulanje Mission Hospital Management team was very supportive in terms of human resource and transport.

#### 6.0 CHALLENGES

- ➤ Fuel crisis which hit the country and the van which was used to carry materials was off the road.
- > Roofing materials were out of stock
- > Weather conditions of rainy season ie gardening Vs sanitation issues.

#### 7.0 LESSON LEARNT

➤ Based on the success of this programme other development projects can also use the same structures to advance their activities.

# MULANJE MISSION HOSPITAL 2023 CBM FUNDED ACTIVITIES REPORT FOR THE SECOND PHASE

#### 1.0 BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Mulanje Mission Hospital is in Mulanje District. It is located in Mulanje Central Constituency. It serves a population of 94,834 people. *Source of data H.S.A head count 2022*.

It offers its services under 3 Traditional Authorities namely: Chikumbu, Mkanda and Mabuka.

The district was struck by tropical Cyclone Anna on 25<sup>th</sup> January, 2022 and Mulanje Mission Hospital was privileged to receive funding from Christian Blind Mission. It started responding on 2<sup>nd</sup> July, 2022. In summary during the first phase a total of 506 pit latrines roofed with corrugated iron sheets and san plats fixed on the floor were constructed with coverage of 101%. For details please see the first report.

#### 1.1 VISION AND MISSION STATEMENT

All activities outlined are in line with the vision of Mulanje Mission Hospital which is to transform the catchment area with improved sanitation and provide strategic leadership leading to well-coordinated health education messages.

#### 2.0 MAIN OBJECTIVE

The main objective is to have communities that have reduced incidences of water and sanitary related diseases.

#### 2.1 SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

The specific objectives of the activities are:

- To have increased number of sanitation facilities in T/A Chikumbu, Mabuka and Mkanda.
- To have communities that is practicing safe hygiene practices.

#### 3.0 IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PROJECT

#### 3.1 INTRODUCTION OF THE PROGRAMME TO THE COMMUNITY

This programme is a continuation of the first programme which constructed 506 pit latrines. Chiefs and Local leaders were briefed that this activity is targeting poorest of poorest of the poor who failed to built pit latrines in the first programme because they failed to source quarry stones and to pay labour.

Health Surveillance Assistant responsible for the concerned villages were also briefed about this programme. Seven villages were selected for the programme and their names, demographic data and targets are as appended below.

#### 3.2 **SELECTION CRETERIA**

The selection criteria of the six chosen villages was based on those who failed to build Latrines in the first programme despite provision of materials for the programme so they were provided with quarry stones and a contractor was paid by the programme.

Ng'oma the 7<sup>th</sup> village was given a target of 50 pit Latrines and they followed the criteria as in the first programme. See first report for details

After Contractors had dugs the 50 pit Latrines and Ng'oma village had also dug its 50 pit Latrines, the health workers and the co-ordinator went around the villages for Verification exercise. After building the super structures another verification was done and roofing materials were supplied.

#### 3.4 OTHER ACTIVITIES DONE BY THE PROGRAMME

The programme also helped families in the disabled group in providing roofing materials during construction of their houses. One family composed of a father and a mother both of them are dumb and the other family is a child headed family. Four other disabled families were also helped with roofing materials and cement making a total of six families.

- The village health committees were able to conduct supervision and followups on their own
- Some villages took their own personal initiative of introducing a village register of recording major activities of the project done in the village and visitors records.
- Medical students who were doing practicals were visiting the project villages which boosted the moral of the villages.
- Support from the hospital administration in terms of man power and transport.

#### 6.0 CHALLENGES

- Weather conditions like the down pouring of the heavy rains which also destroyed some of the structures which were in progress.
- Late procurement of some materials.
- On and off availability of fuel in the country.
